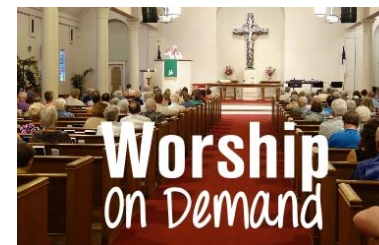

Evensong

The practice of singing choral evensong derives from Anglican liturgical traditions of the sixteenth century. When the English church separated from the Roman Catholic Church during the reign of King Henry VIII of England (r. 1509-47) the new Protestant Anglican church in England replaced the singing of the Catholic evening offices of Vespers and Compline with a new service called Evening Prayer. This service traditionally incorporates scripture lessons, prayers and responses, a Confession, the singing of Psalms and hymns, one or more choral anthems, and one or more Canticles, usually the *Magnificat* and the *Nunc dimittis*.

The celebration of evensong at Northminster on November 5, 2017 follows traditional models for Choral Evensong in many ways, but it differs from most traditional evensong services in the variety of its musical expressions. This worship service especially celebrates the breadth and variety of Northminster's traditional music ministries over the past 66 years. Much of this tradition was built by Dr. Stardust (Dusty) Johnson, recently-retired Director of Music at Northminster, who directed the Traditional Music Ministries at Northminster for 40 years until her retirement in September 2017.
